EQUITABLE DINNERS @WORK

Out of Hand Theater offers custom Equitable Dinners at Work on a variety of racial equity and other equity topics. These Dinners (or breakfasts or lunches) support our clients' commitment to advancing equity and inclusion by providing meaningful opportunities for empathy and engagement. Equitable Dinners at Work combines art to open hearts, information to open minds, and conversation to process emotions and data and make a plan for action. In addition, these programs build the muscle of courageous conversation, by providing a safe space to practice talking about race and other difficult topics.

Details:

Out of Hand's Equitable Dinners at Work occur remotely, via Zoom. The program begins with a welcome, followed by the performance of an original 10-minute play designed to illuminate equity issues, engage empathy, and launch the conversation. Next comes a Polling Activity and a short talk to introduce terminology. After this, attendees move into virtual breakout rooms, with no more than 10 attendees and a trained facilitator in each room, for a facilitated conversation using a custom dialogue guide. We end each dinner with a full group closing. The program lasts about 90 minutes.

WHY IT'S SPECIAL

- Art Accelerating Empathy, understanding and dialogue
- Small Group Conversations with a trained facilitator in every breakout room
- Racial Diversity in every breakout room
- Equitable Dinners attendees come from 40 states, including 90 Georgia cities and town, plus 8 foreign countries. They represent the racial diversity of our nation, with 60% white attendees, and 40% Black, Indigenous, and other people of color. They are equally diverse in age, with 22% between the ages of 18 and 39, 45% between 40 and 59, and 34% 60 and older. 86% of attendees say the event caused them to think more deeply about racial equity, and 85% say it made them more likely to take anti-racist action. Over 2,000 people have attended.
